These courses fulfill the **Junior** year History requirement. They will be taught as a full year class, registering for one course each semester. 2700-Fall 2710-Spring **Students are required to be in this course for the full year in order to receive the high school credit.**

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- Concurrent Enrollment is college-level coursework given to motivated high school students with a desire to get an early start on their career path. With successful completion of each course, students will receive **both high school AND college credit.**
- All concurrent enrollment courses require students to become enrolled at the college the course is offered through. A one time enrollment fee is charged through that college, usually \$30.00-\$40.00.
- Strict college enrollment and course registration deadlines apply to concurrent enrollment students. Students will be dropped from their course(s) if they miss these deadlines.
- Tuition is \$5.00 per credit. For example, a 3 credit hour class would cost \$15.00.
- Books and lab fees may also apply, and vary for each course.
- Grades given will be on the student's permanent college transcript.
- Attendance in these courses is very important and will affect a student's grade.
